The Robert C. Geer Memorial Hospital Incorporated opened and served the tri-state area as a general hospital until about 1945. The Hospital was initially funded by two sisters in memory of their late brother Robert C. Geer.

Geer Adult Day Center (originally named Gateway) opened, as an alternative to more expensive home care, in response to the growing number of elderly individuals in need of care during the day when their caregivers were at work.

Geer Memorial Health Center (now Geer Nursing & Rehab Center) opened as a 120-bed, a state-of-the-art nursing facility. The new facility quickly established itself with physicians and professional caregivers as a premier provider of skilled nursing care.

Geer Dial-a-Ride began to address the isolation of elderly and disabled individuals living in a rural area without public transportation.

Geer opened a new unit apart from the main building to accommodate income sensitive residents.

Geer Pharmacy opened, a non-profit retail pharmacy giving residents, employees, and family of Geer campus employees access to prescription drugs below retail prices.

Geer expanded Beckley House to 10 additional units of low-income housing.

Covid-19 Pandemic forced the permanent closure of the Geer Adult Day Center.

Geer expanded Beckley House, a 34-unit apartment residence for limited income seniors.

Geer Lodge opened (originally called Geer Village) – an independent, assisted living residence and regional gathering center. The Lodge includes a full-service YMCA available to the residents, employees and community.

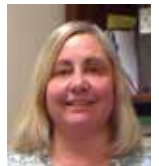
Brenda McGhee
